We're a Family of Readers



When families share a love of reading, children develop stronger literacy skills and are more motivated to pick up a book. Here are some suggestions for making reading a family affair.

After-dinner Novel

Your family picks a novel all ages can enjoy—perhaps think of one you or your spouse enjoyed as a child—and take turns reading a chapter a night. Soon, your children will look forward to that time together, especially if you stopped at a cliff—hanger the day before! After each chapter, share your opinions of the book and say what you think will happen tomorrow.

Reading Adventures

Every time you visit the library, look for books related to someplace you're going soon. Before a visit to the aquarium, check out nonfiction books about sharks and dolphins. Before a trip to a family member's apartment in the city, read about skyscrapers, subways, and taxis.

Treasure Hunts

When children are first learning to read, invite them to search for free reading 'treasure'! Ask them to collect maps from parks and malls, brochures from the vet's office, and even fortunes from cookies. Soon, your whole family can add to the 'treasure chest.' You'll soon discover that you'll learn a lot, like how dogs communicate and what fun things there are to do at your favorite park.
